



 Harriet Tubman  was born  200  years  ago  in the USA.






 Her  mother  and father  were from  Africa.

 Harriet's  family  had a master  who was  very rich.















 Harriet's family lived in a small hut with no furniture.

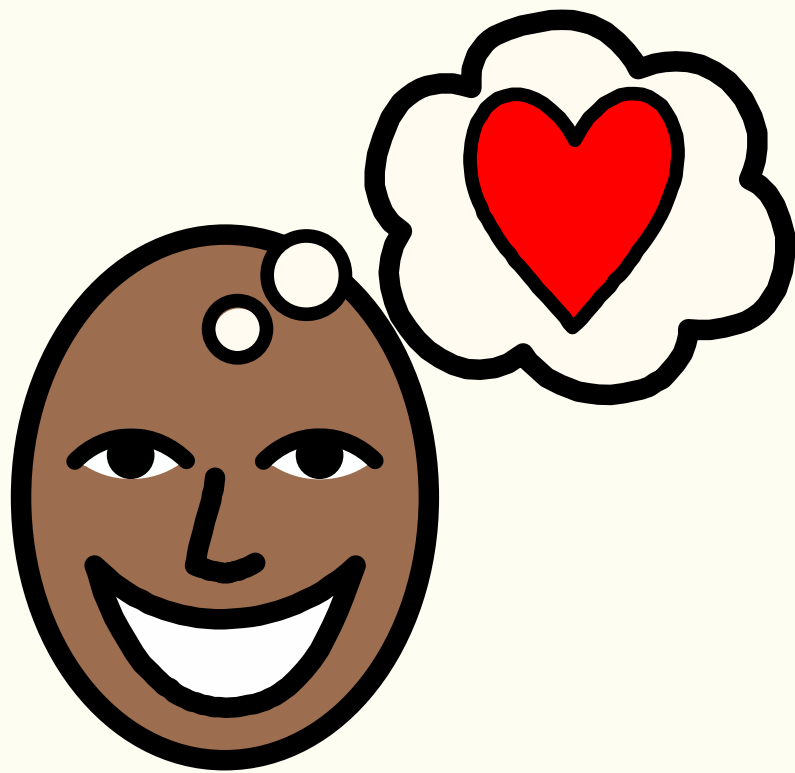





 The master lived in a big house on the hill.

























 The slaves worked growing cotton for the master.













 The slaves weren't paid and had only a little food.

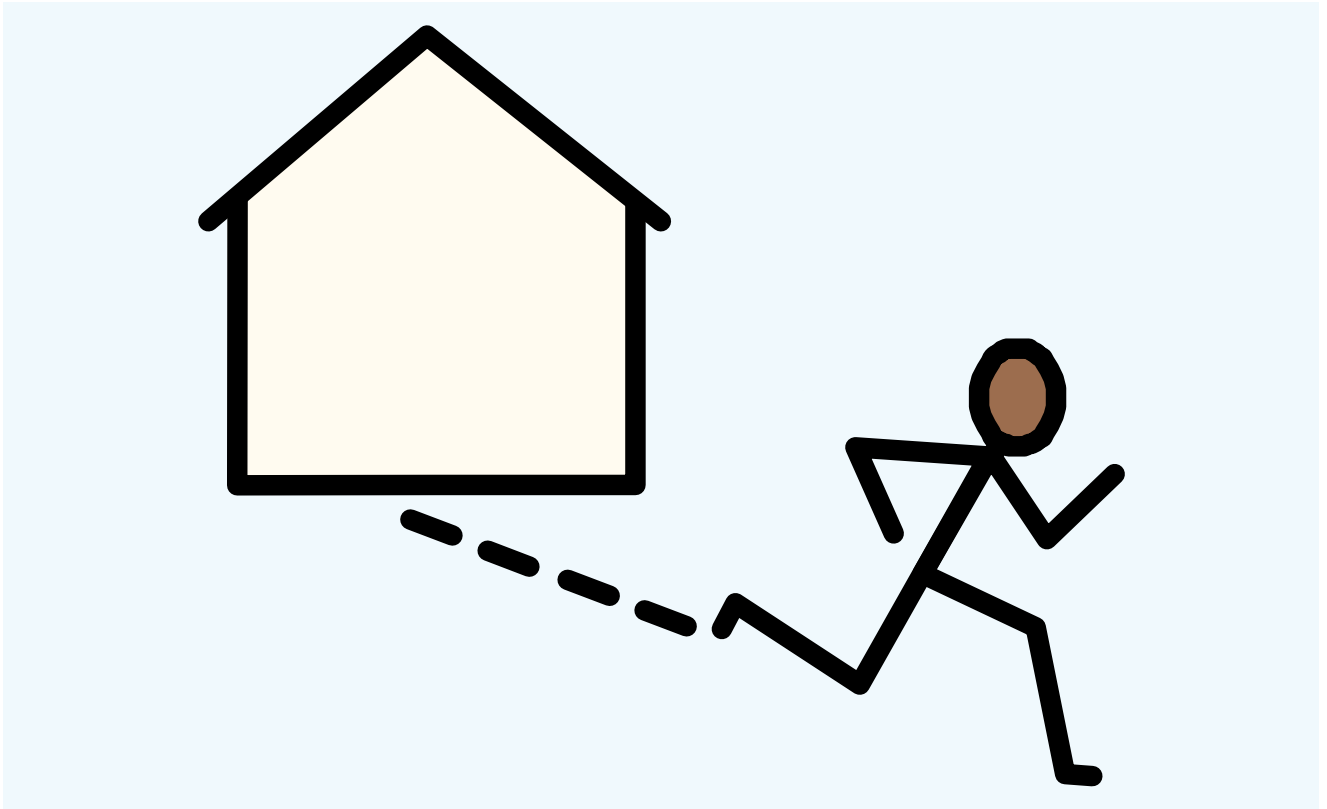




















 While Harriet worked, she imagined becoming free.












 Harriet knew there was no slavery in Pennsylvania.







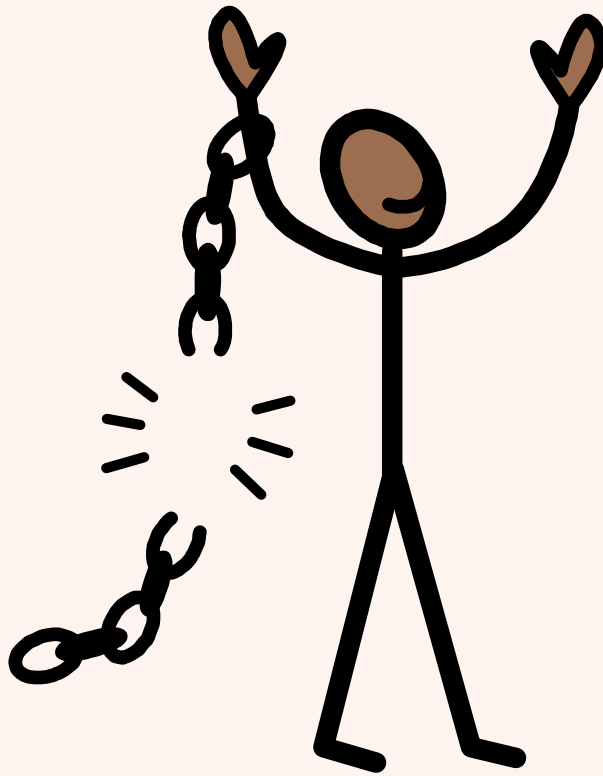








 Then one day, one of the slaves ran away.

 These safe places were called the Underground Railroad.

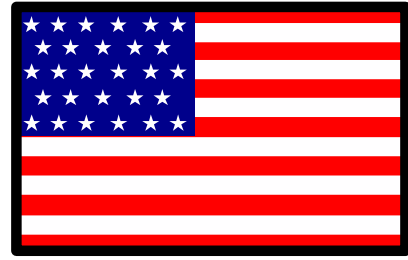






 It was not really a railway, it was a secret route.







 Harriet helped more than 70 slaves to escape.

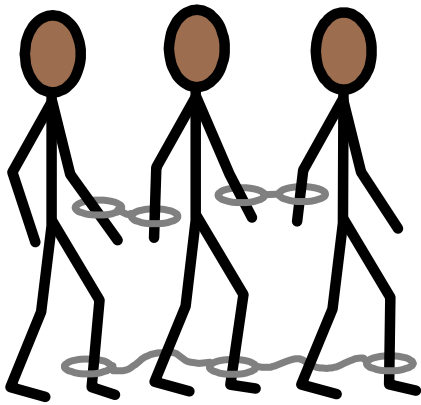
