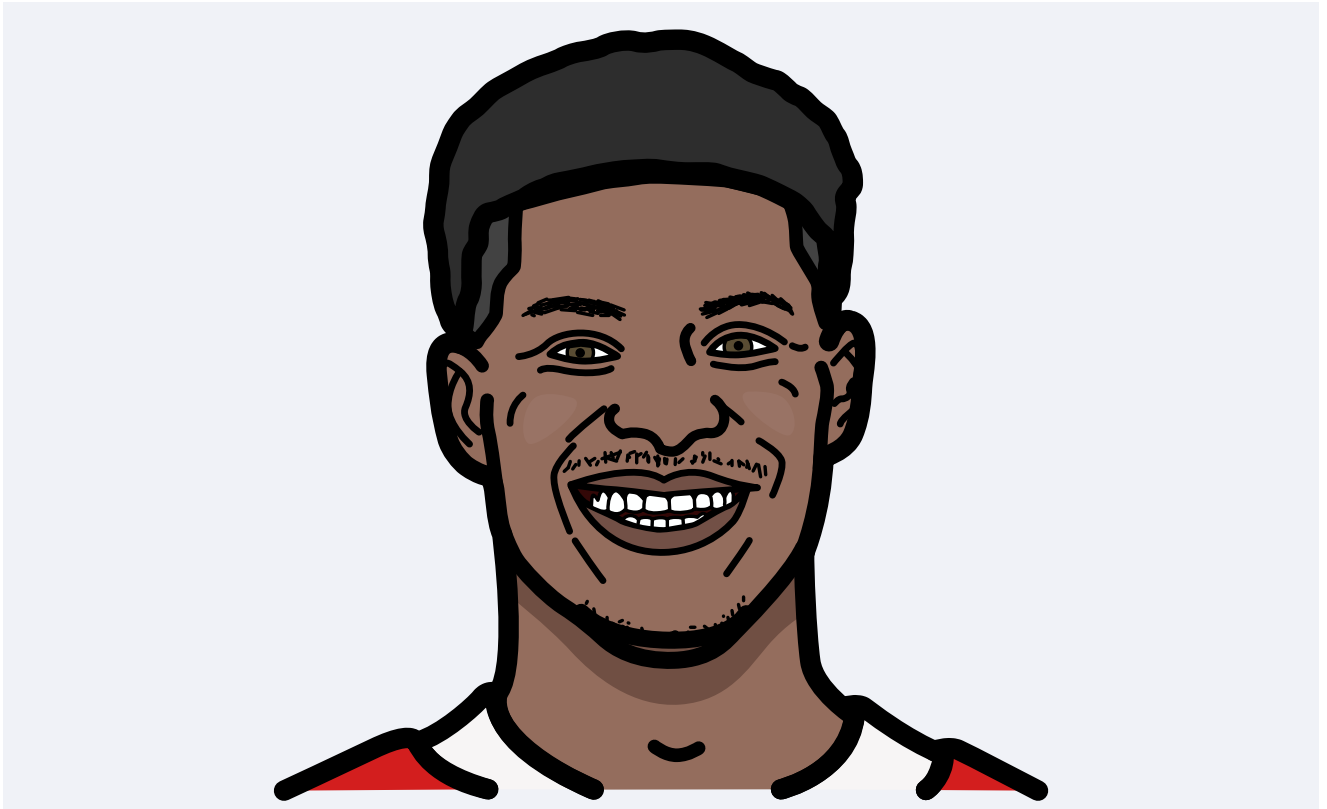

Manchester United is a world-famous football club.

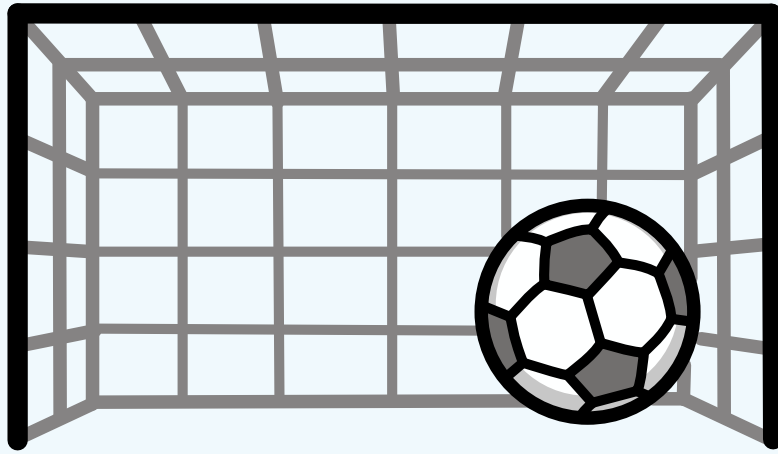


Marcus began playing for Manchester United aged 17.

He has won the FA Cup and the League Cup.



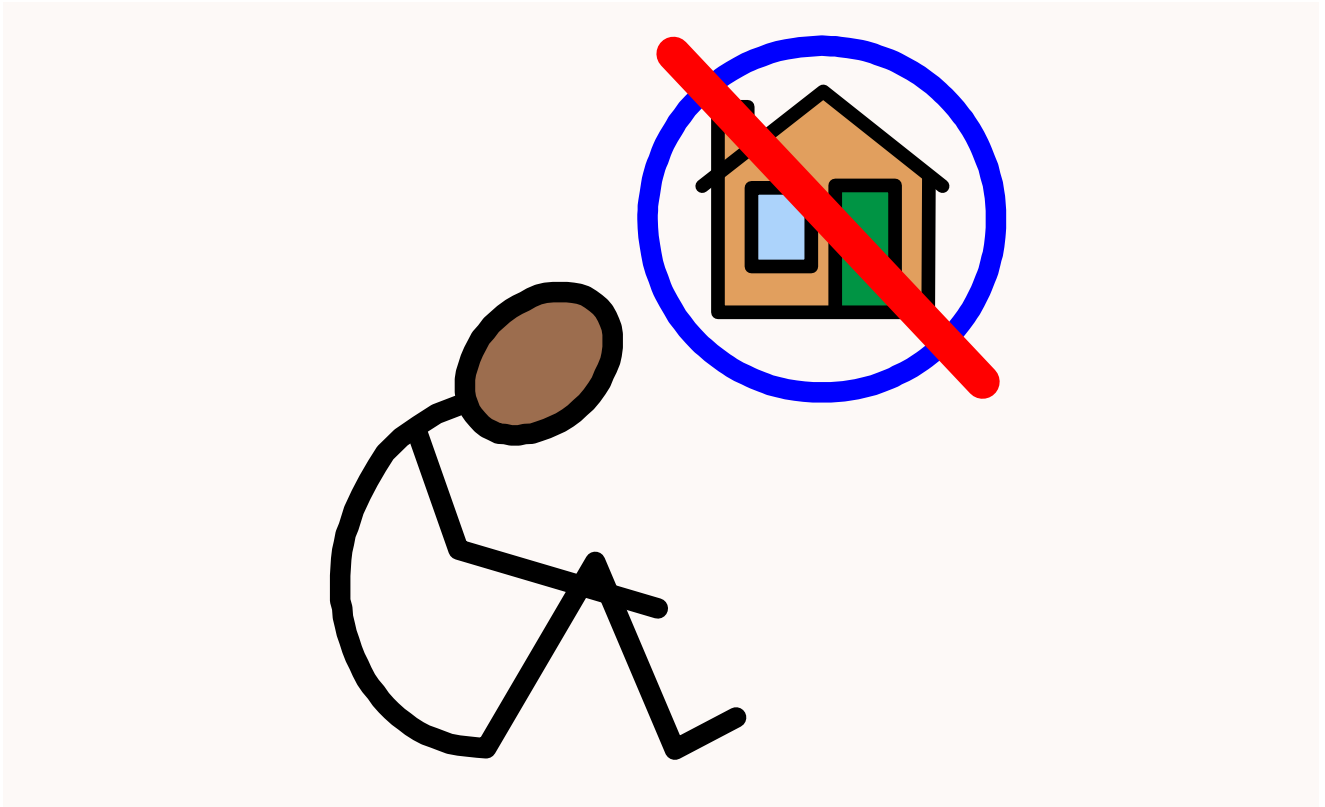
In 2016 Marcus was picked to play for England.

England were beaten by Italy in the final.



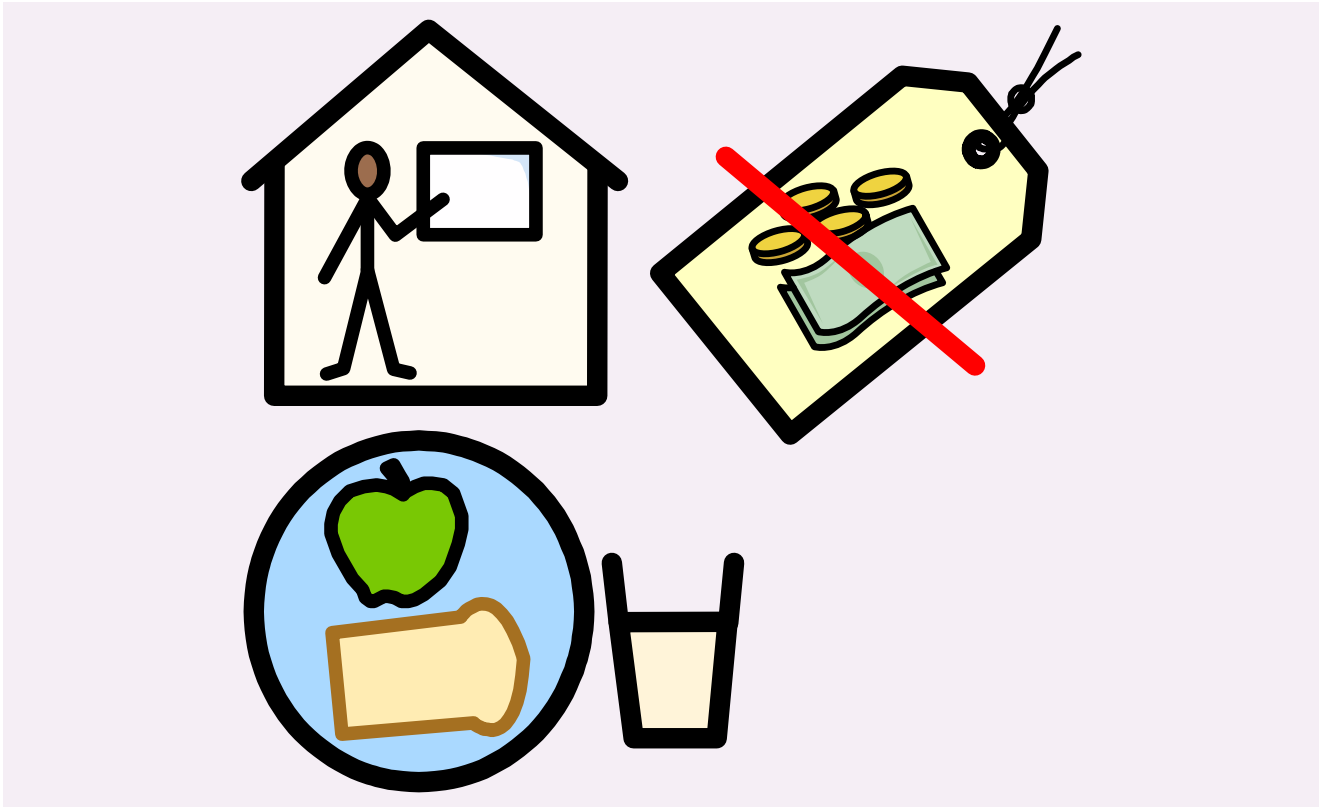


In 2019 Marcus started the "In the Box" campaign.

He was disappointed by not being able to help more.

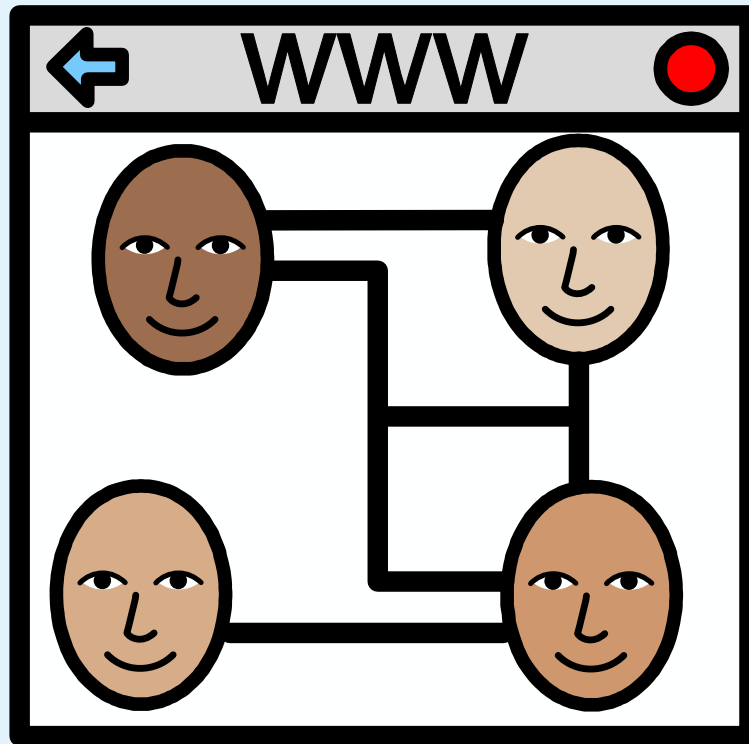


FairShare is a poverty and food waste charity.

Free school meals were extended over the summer.

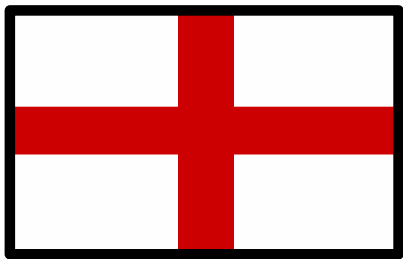
Marcus was awarded an MBE for this work.
