Her mother was a traditional healer or "doctress".



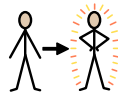

Florence grew up wanting to be a nurse.



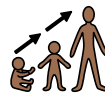
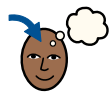
Her parents did not agree with her.

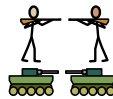

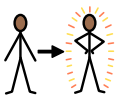

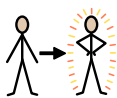
