


Stuart Hall was born in Jamaica in 1932.

Afterwards he began to study politics.




In 1957 Stuart joined CND.

He examined youth culture, music and advertising.




Stuart became an important figure in multi culturalism.

All types of culture were important to Stuart.




Stuart wrote about Reception Theory.

Audiences could accept or reject these meanings.




In 1979 Stuart joined the Open University.

He was also a very powerful speaker.


Stuart died in 2014 aged 81.
