


  Remembrance Day is on the **11th**  November.




 This day remembers the end of  WW1.

 We remember the war  on Remembrance Sunday.


  It is the  closest Sunday to the **11th**  November.

The  war  ended at  11am.


There is a  two  minute  silence  at  11am.

The Cenotaph is a war memorial in London.




The King visits it on Remembrance Sunday.
