Potiphar dreams the seven thin cows eat the seven healthy cows.




Potiphar dreams about heads of grain.

Potiphar worries about the dreams.

He sends for all the magicians and wise men in Egypt.

None of them can tell Potiphar what the dreams mean.

      
The wine server remembers Joseph in prison.

The wine server tells Potiphar about the time he was in prison.

He tells Potiphar about the dreams he and the baker had.


The wine server tells Potiphar that Joseph understands dreams.

Joseph tells Potiphar that God understands dreams.




Potiphar tells Joseph about the cows in his dream.

No-one can tell him what the dream means.






Potiphar tells Joseph about the grain in his dream.

The fat cows and the fat heads of grain are good years.

After seven good years there will be a famine.

People will forget what it is like to have plenty of food."

       
God wants Potiphar to understand what God is planning.

Joseph says, "You had two dreams about the same thing.  
Why? God wants to show you He will really make this happen.  
God will make it happen soon."

       
Potiphar is to collect grain during the good years.

Joseph tells Potiphar to choose a wise and intelligent man.  
He must help other men collect food for the people.  
People must give some of their grain during the good years.

        
People can eat the grain they collect during the famine.

The food they collect must be stored in the cities.

Then during the seven bad years people can eat this food.

The famine will not destroy Egypt.

      
Potiphar asks Joseph to collect the grain.

This seems like a good idea to Potiphar.

Potiphar says to Joseph, "God showed you all these things.

You must be a very wise man."

      
Joseph is a very important person in Egypt.

Potiphar makes Joseph governor of Egypt.

He gives Joseph a special ring.

He gives Joseph some special clothes.

In the  good  years  Joseph  collects  a lot  of grain.

During the seven good years the crops grow well.

Joseph collects the grain and stores it in the cities.


Joseph collects a lot of grain.

Then the seven bad years begin.


No grain grows in any of the countries near Egypt.
